

Artist Profile: Rodney Williams

Writing poems for over 50 years, Rodney Williams is the editor of 'Catchment - Poetry of Place', a literary journal within the Bbaa website. Its first edition went live online in December 2023, presenting work from 65 Australian



poets, in Western free verse and Japanese-based tanka. Its second issue will be released in June 2024.

A former secretary of the Australian Haiku Society, Rodney has had writing in that genre published widely, here and overseas. He has also done editorial work with tanka in the 'Atlas Poetica' website (USA).

His longer poetry has appeared in significant periodicals, including 'Mascara Literary Review,' 'Overland' and 'The Long Paddock' from 'Southerly' (Australia); plus 'Adelaide Literary Magazine' (NYC) and 'Antipodes' (also USA); along with 'Blackmail Press' (NZ) and 'Poetry New Zealand'.

Rodney had essays included in 'Five Bells,' alongside poems. 'StylusLit' has published his poetry and short fiction. His creative prose has also been posted online by the 'Sudo Journal'.

Collaborating on a multi-genre book with oil-painter Otto Boron, Rodney has had six volumes of verse released through Ginninderra Press, with artwork provided by Jeff Thege, Helen Timbury and Sally Walk. He wrote lyrics for CDs by singer-songwriter-guitarists Ricky Allan & Todd Cook.

For 35 years, Rodney was a secondary school English teacher: in retirement - through Bbaa - he convenes Time to Write. He has conducted workshops and presentations within provincial writing festivals, community arts events and the regional library system. Rodney Williams has likewise given readings on radio, in theatrical performances and at poetry nights, including the Melbourne Writers' Festival.



Catchment - Poetry of Place Update March 2024

Released on 21 December 2023, the first edition of *Catchment* has drawn very positive feedback. Work on the second issue of *Catchment – Poetry of Place* is already well under way. Beyond the journal in itself, planning is also taking place for two upcoming events to help promote this project

Writing Workshop towards Catchment

To support writers in developing new pieces of poetry, as potential submissions for *Catchment's* second release, a poetry workshop will be conducted on Sunday, 21 April.

To be presented by Rodney Williams (editor of *Catchment*), this will take place at Art Space 1 at Trafalgar Railway Station (Princes Highway) between 10.30 a.m.—1.00 p.m. on that date.

Participants will be provided with examples of work which has impact in showing a sense of location, within both tanka and longer poetic forms.

Prompts will be given, in the hope of inspiring new poetry of place.

Guidelines for Catchment will be outlined.

With encouragement provided, in a positive atmosphere,

suggestions may also be offered, in relation to developing early ideas

From there, poets taking part would have a full month in which to refine their writing in draft form, towards making submissions to the second release of the poetry journal.

Light refreshments will be provided.

Writers should bring their own writing materials, as well as any drafts of poems about place.

No participation fee will be required.

Public Readings of Poems from Catchment

A second exciting event linked to *Catchment* will involve a set of public readings of poems selected from its first edition!

This will take place at the Community Hub in Oak Street, Drouin, on Sunday, 19 May, commencing at 2.00 p.m. This facility is located beside the Drouin Croquet Club, opposite 3BBREM

Entry has been set at \$10 per person, as a joint fundraiser. Baw Baw Arts Alliance is collaborating with Off the Leash Theatre Company and 3BBRFM for this event.

Anyone wishing to attend will be able to book through the Bbaa website.

Poets with work in the first issue of *Catchment* will be contacted in advance, giving them a chance to participate

directly, as well as to hear readings of poems by a range of other writers.

Alternatively, contributors will be able to give permission for their work to be selected for reading by members of Off the Leash Theatre Company.

OTL's Jeannie Haughton is working with Sue Murphy & Rodney Williams from Bbaa in planning, along with 3BBR's Paul Strickland, who will record readings for broadcast.

Writers & actors will receive more detailed information in due course about a rehearsal commencing at 1.00 on Sunday 5 May, also at the Community Hub in Oak Street, Drouin.

Anyone reading poems on 19 May will need to have attended that rehearsal a fortnight earlier.

Making Submissions to Edition 2 of Catchment

The submission window for *Catchment's* second issue will open on 21 March 2024.

Poems showing a sense of location can be submitted until 21 May

Issue # 2 of *Catchment* will then go live online through the Bbaa's website on 21 June.

Again, poets resident in Australia can offer work focussed on a sense of place as either longer poems or tanka, or both.

Appreciated deeply for their support with the first edition, poets who made submissions last time are strongly encouraged to offer further poems, as are writers new to the journal.

Once the next submission window opens on 21 March, contributors will see that writing offered needs to be inserted into a digital proforma, as a new approach, this second time around. *Catchment* has only a small IT team, with a new edition involving a lot of work. Such a change will make processes connected to editing/ formatting/ uploading far more practicable/ sustainable.

We look forward to receiving fine poetry of place from Gippsland and beyond!

TANKA: Jeannie Haughton

Jeannie Haughton writes primarily for performance, having many works produced; also freelance articles. Poetry allows her to play with words, images and ideas. Sometimes its rigorous forms attract her; other times playfulness or the catharsis is just what she needs.



Searches through Tall Timber Alleyne Hall

In memory of my father, John Leslie Hall From Tallarook, VIC – June, 1931

After our first search, in teeming rain, on horseback, through mud and steep bush, they radioed me at the station...
I still had a feeling the plane had come down in this area —
I reckoned he'd hit tall timber, up in these Tallarook mountains.
It was J. H. Ekin, civil aviation inspector of aircraft thrilled with his hobby, with success at his mastery of the bi-plane:

He'd told me once, he could observe the land below as if from the centre of the universe...

his destination an aero pageant, but he had never arrived.

I had laughed – as a Senior Constable myself, I saw humans as the middle of the world...

The Minister of Aviation had ten planes searching From Essendon, along the Murray, to Albury.

Joe Ekin's Moth was wood and fabric over tubes of steel
At a time of transport on foot or by horse-power through bush.

Yes, at the police station I had a phone

But when I heard a knock at the door, it was Giesue Adello

An Italian rabbit trapper – he had found the plane

Walking five miles through thick bush to tell me...

I stared in utter disbelief, before gathering ranks; horses and men.

For two hours we trekked, through rain and bush and mud.

And there it was, the lost plane... Ekin still strapped tight,

Stiff, white. From a head injury, his blood had drained out...

So there we were, on the front page of the city paper Photographed at the scene, amid the tall trees

Thotographica at the secret, affilia the tall trees

With the plane embedded head-first in the soil

And us standing silent, among the mountain gums

Stern-faced, shocked – a case closed to us...

Alleyne Hall is a member of the Time to Write group through Baw Baw Arts Alliance. Writing poetry for about eight years, she creates poems and narratives, with a focus on nature and spiritual matters, travel and family. She is also devoted to painting in oils.



Artist Profile:



Kelly Williamson has always leaned toward creativity and spent her childhood exploring dance, drama, and poetry. As an adult she has also enjoyed photography. Her eldest son had been attending painting classes for a while and she had a discussion with him about how wonderful it must be to be able to create art and how she would love to be able to do what he did. He asked, "Why don't you give it a go"? and that one question, five years ago, began her journey to canvas and brush. Part of her journey has also been the mentoring she receives from a wonderful artist, Heather Bradbury.

Kelly always works in oils, refers to her style as realistic and has a deep

appreciation for the natural world. She finds inspiration in the delicate intricacies of the world around us. She says, 'I have found that I am especially drawn to how light hits a subject. I also adore the grace and colours of birdlife.'

While Kelly is inspired to paint from the natural world she is also stimulated and inspired by many elements in the world of art from the Renaissance period to contemporary art. Much of her love of light on a subject comes from her appreciation of Rembrandt's work.



When thinking about the process

she uses to create a work of art, Kelly describes, 'I be able to paint I must first feel an attachment to, and a compulsion to capture the subject. I firstly sketch the subject, then often have found that painting brings stillness to my busy world. I disappear into the canvas and to will work to paint the background. I then focus on the subject, blocking in the first coat,



creating the light and darks of the subject, and then continues to build and layer my work and complete finer detail. After allowing my paintings to dry, which can take a significant number of months dependent on weather and oils used, the work is varnished enhancing the colours.

At present work life sees Kelly limited in the time she needs to put brush to canvas but she hopes to keep growing and exploring, able to spend much more time with her art in the future, taking the opportunity to explore different styles.

Artist Profile: Deborah Churchill



I am a mixed media artist, frequently experimenting with the compatibility of all mediums and techniques but I have a particular love of pen and ink, which is always featured in my work. I would describe my art as human form in the nouveau style using mixed medium in a narrative way.

I have always known art was for me;

learning to sew and knit from a young age, I made my first calico rag doll when I was only 10 years old. I was instantly hooked on the fascination of creating something with its own character from fabric, wool and embroidery thread, it was pure magic.

In the 1980s I started making porcelain, antique, reproduction dolls. I particularly loved the German character dolls which led to the learning of the history and techniques of the old doll makers, including mould making, slip casting, firing, china painting, body construction, heirloom sewing, mohair wigs, shoemaking and hat making. During this time, I did many workshops and specialised courses to become an accredited Master Doll Maker and Judge. As a result, I operated my own business for 15 years, teaching doll making classes, repairing antique dolls and toys.

With all these skills I supposed creating art in mixed medium made perfect sense.

My ideas come from the love of nostalgia and escapism from the fast and somewhat challenging world we live in today. I am inspired by the Art Nouveau period and the elaborate advertising from this time. Individual artists who inspire me are Gustav Klimt, Alphonse Mucha, Albert Vargas, Norman Lindsay, Mirka Mora, and Norman Rockwell are my inspiration.

My process starts with colour palette, samples of pieces and an idea, which has been stored somewhere in my brain, the more art I create the more the ideas emerge!

I hope people will see my art as gentle and reflective storytelling. ~


