### Easter Art Sale 2025

For the fifth year in a row the Baw Baw Arts Alliance (Bbaa), with the Warragul Rotary Club, held its annual Easter Art Sale. The annual sale supports artists and give members of the public the opportunity to buy works straight off the wall.

For the first time there was a 'Hangers' Prize' awarded. Each year a dedicated group of members in the Arts Alliance hang the Art but this time they were also given the opportunity of voting for their favourite piece. Congratulations go to painter, Lynette Coade, for being the 2025 recipient of the inaugural 'Hangers' Prize'.

The stats for 2025 show were better than expected considering we were in a new location. We had a total of 284 wonderful paid entries with 76 extra entries, and our sales total was 45 – an exceptional result. We had 639 visitors through the door with Good Friday and Easter Saturday being the best for the week. The location turned out to be very good for passing visitors and it was great to welcome them in and tell them all about our Easter Art Sale. I also recognised many return faces from previous years which show we have a good following. 27 members of Bbaa helped to put the show on with an equal number of Rotary members. A big thank you to the hanging team of Dot, Anita, Ing, Jeff, Robert, Janine, and Alene. It's a huge job to get this show hung so it looks inviting for all to attend, and our team worked hard for three days to make it happen. Big thanks to Sue, Janine and Wendy who help with the taking in of the work and the picking up of the work all fast paced jobs and done expertly.

Another big thank you goes to RAV (Regional Arts Victoria) who granted us \$2764.50 to cover the hall hire and the changing of venue and dates on all our road signs.

The Victoria Hall although smaller turned out to be a very good venue. It's in the centre of town (almost), has good foot traffic, and parking turned out to be easy. We have reserved it again for next year and have decided that we will be able to fit in 3D which was very much missed this year.

We have a good working relationship with Rotary and each year the organisation side of the Art Sale get better. We don't make huge sums of money, but we set this Art Sale up to benefit artists and we continue to keep entry fees and commission taken low in our endeavour to support our artists of Baw Baw and beyond.

Plans are already underway for another combined Warragul Rotary and Arts Alliance Easter Sale in 2026. Dates for next year with Easter being earlier are opening Good Friday, 3rd April, and closing Sunday 12th April.


On the 1st June be thoroughly entertained or participate in Poetry Bauhaus.

### Flags of Hope



We are having communal painting sessions in the VRI Hall at 1.30 -3.30 on Friday 23rd May and 13th June, a sewing day on 27th June, and a celebration and hanging day on 4th June in Civic Park, Warragul.

This project is about Hope, Harmony and Love.

The human spirit is a symphony of courage and potential, joy, love, peace and hope. Hope resonates in all of our souls. Hope is the combination and connection of fragmented spiritual beliefs across the planet. All humans hold the way of virtuousness by that of the soul,

hope is at play in the pathos of human co-habitation.

In a world distorted by greed, corruption and selfishness, narcissism, power and increased natural disasters, it is in this time - our time here on planet earth that goodwill, inner and outer peace are now our most important currency. Where we have fallen out of balance with the light and the dark in our spiritual beings. Harmony brings us together.

The connection of all life's occurrences, interconnectedness consumes our way of being rather than bringing in harmonious energy of our being together. Flags of Hope is an endeavour to unite all faiths and beliefs with goodwill and peace, to help restore a balance.

We're asking a bunch of creative people to give a message of hope, in the form of a painted flag or two, to send goodwill, healing, peace and hope into the world, that may go towards making a small contribution to restoring balance throughout the world.

Based on the concept of Buddhist prayer flags, the words and images on each flag will, as they blow in the wind, send their messages of goodwill around the world. Helping to bring positive energy to our increasingly negative world.

We hope that others who are inspired by this the action join us and connect with others to make their own flags of hope.

On a large scale, Flags of Hope is a way to connect face to face and help each other resolve our differences and create harmony and understanding in everyday life - love, peace and joy, without judgement. Flags of Hope, peace and goodwill is a place to dig deep and surrender, go past issues personal and of the world and find a genuine connection of all things.

If the essence of nature is life, then we are hope in the making. Specification.

Based on the principles of Buddhist prayer flags, the intent is to gather positive creative thoughts from members of our community, and paint thousands of flags, that, when they flap in the wind, send those positive thoughts blowing around the world.

All individuals or groups can contribute to the project - from any walk of life, religious or non-religious - as long as the message is a positive one that relates to the worldwide community, without

discrimination of any kind. Let your imagination run riot! No reference to any one god, icon or state, as others may not relate to your beliefs.

Paint a flag with any image that is an honest description of HOPE to you. It could be words, pictures, graphics, cartoons, anything that is positive and has the possibility of spreading positive vibes around the world.

The size is A4 (297 x 210mm) which is the size of a normal piece of paper. This will be folded in half across a cord for display - see the sketch below.

Any medium can be used, from oil paints on canvas, to felt pens on scraps of natural fabric. The only consideration is that they will be displayed outside, so they must be weatherproof.

We will have some group painting sessions, but you are welcome to create flags outside these events. And when we have enough flags, we will have a get together to sew them all onto cord for display outside.  $\sim$

With the fourth issue of *Catchment - Poetry of Place* due for release - through the Bbaa website - on 21st June, 2025, readers can look forward to another set of fresh new poems offered by contributors from various Australian states and territories.

In different ways, the pieces of poetry selected will continue to display a strong sense of location, focusing on spots found within Australia or overseas, captured in two contrasting forms of writing.

Readers who have already visited *Catchment* will know that this digital journal charges no subscription fee, allowing free access to work by a range of writers, some widely respected in the Australian literary scene, others earlier in their journey as poets. They create both longer poems written in Western free verse, and tanka, composed in a traditional Japanese short-form.

As editor, I can only give my deepest thanks yet again to Sue Murphy and other members of the Bbaa committee, for supporting writing as a creative medium; as well as to the IT team within this Arts Alliance, Mike and Marlene Ogden, for working tirelessly, showing great expertise and commitment in bringing *Catchment* to you all so seamlessly.

Jennifer Fell & Jo McInerney likewise continue to offer tremendous backing, with the editorial support they provide to me being invaluable in helping to review longer work, towards inclusion: Jenn also gives valued assistance in

helping to promote submissions; while Jo has written a marvellous essay about tanka, featured within *Catchment News & Views*.



### Alice in Wonderland

The "Alice in Wonderland" project has been declared a success with over 160 visitors in attendance over the Anzac Day long weekend.

The public are invited to view the result in the foyer of the West Gippsland Arts Centre over the month of May. The exhibition will remain on display until June 2 in the foyer of the West Gippsland Arts Centre from 10.00am – 4.00pm weekdays. Entry is free.

Sixteen local artists of diverse age and abilities came together and donated their time and materials to create an installation on site to the theme of "Alice in Wonderland" over two days. The public were invited to not only to view the work in progress, but also to participate in making the piece. The community helped to decorate elements of "The Mad Tea Party" and make items for the "Queen's garden".

We estimate that around half of the attendees stopped to make art, and most of them spent at least an hour decorating teapots or teacups or making flowers and butterflies. We think that this is because the audience were invited to make a meaningful artistic contribution to our installation - rather than just a token invitation to colour in a premade object.

The aims of the project were to ignite imagination and wonder and to bring joy, by creating a sense of community and wellbeing through collaboration. The artists used sustainable or recycled materials where possible. We believe we met those aims and are very happy with the format of our project, although we would like to make improvements to our event advertising. The group would like to repeat the project but with a new theme next year.

The project director Jo Draisma would like to thank Melissa Forlano and the West Gippsland Arts Centre for their support and the sponsorship of Baw Baw Arts Alliance. The project also received many donated goods from the lovely friends and family of the artists and the good people at "Vintage Vibes" in Warragul.

### Artist Profile: Fusion Fibre Arts Network

Fusion Fibre Arts Network is a creative textile and fibre art network, established in East Gippsland in October 2008.

The aim of the network is to provide members with the opportunity to participate in exhibitions, demonstrations and workshops, or any other activity designed to instruct or promote textile fibre art.

The group attracts people of all ages from a wide variety of craft and art disciplines, who are willing to explore and experiment with new and old techniques to produce a range of exciting and original works. The exploration of contemporary and traditional fibre arts fosters and



extends the potential for creativity.

Collaboration between members has always been a strong theme that has run through our exhibitions. We have a very diverse skill base that produces a very broad body of work.

Members predominantly use a variety of textile techniques that are interwoven with other skill sets. Paper, inks, dying, and the use of many traditional art materials are often used in their work.


Knowledge and the use of materials as well as artistic insights are shared. Group discussions have always played a large part, and this approach has been very beneficial for new members providing mentorship where needed.

Although some members are formally trained in fine arts the majority have extended their skill sets by participating in various workshops with both international




